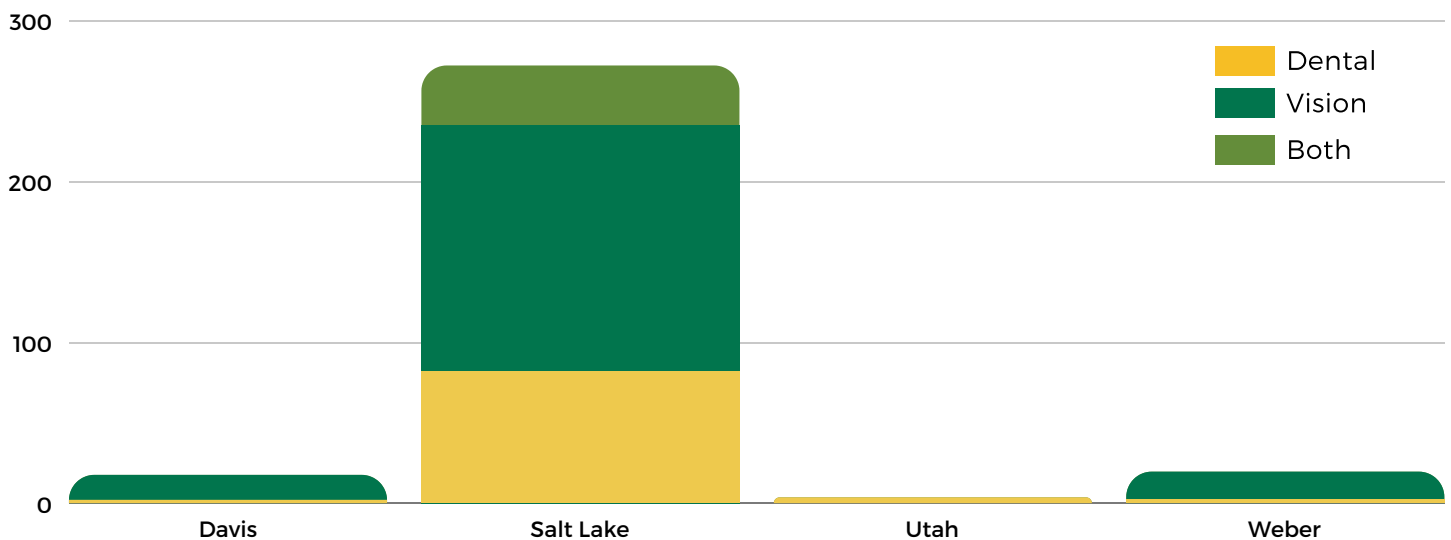


SUMMARY

2021 OVERVIEW

In 2021, Senior Charity Care Foundation hired a new president, continued to recover from the impacts of Covid-19, and helped 311 seniors in need. We also delivered 500 Covid-19 PPE kits to seniors across the Wasatch Front. This has been a successful year, and we are excited to continue growing in 2022.

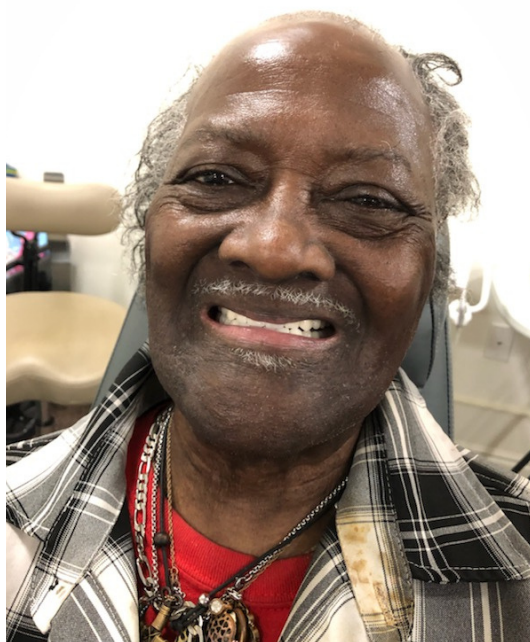
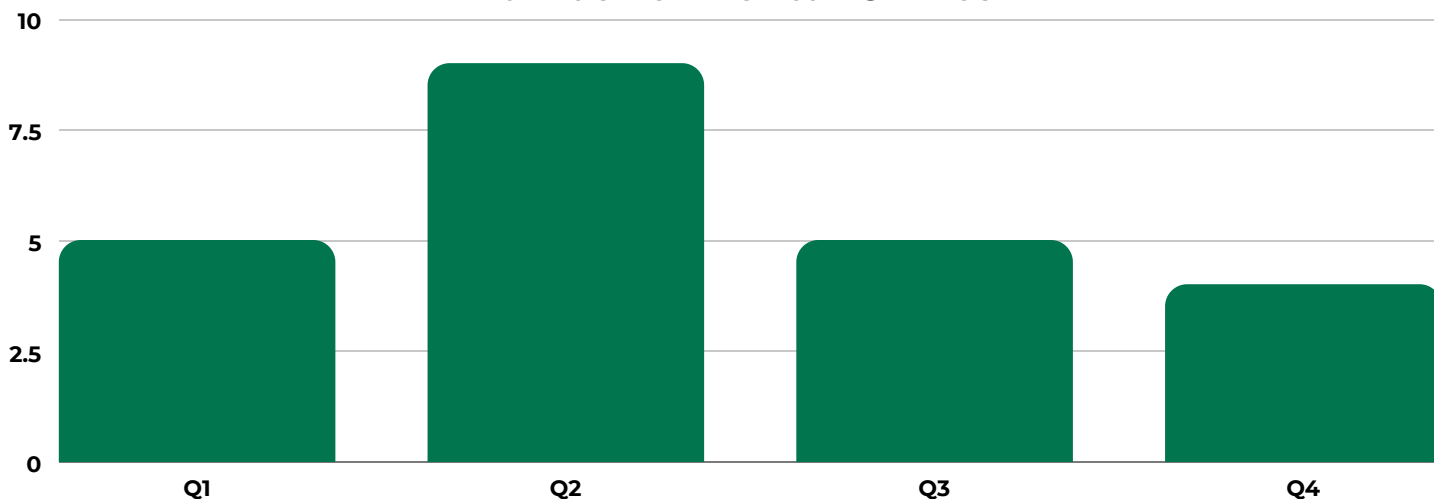

DENTAL PROGRAM

DENTAL PROGRAM SUCCESS

SCCF served 126 dental patients in 2021. This year, 97% of SCCF dental patients reported that they were very satisfied with the level of care they received. Importantly, 100% of the seniors we served said that cleanliness and infection control measures at the clinic met or exceeded their expectations. We are keeping our seniors safe during the ongoing pandemic.

Melvin grew up in North Carolina and served in the Navy. He fell on hard times and ended up homeless in Utah for several years.

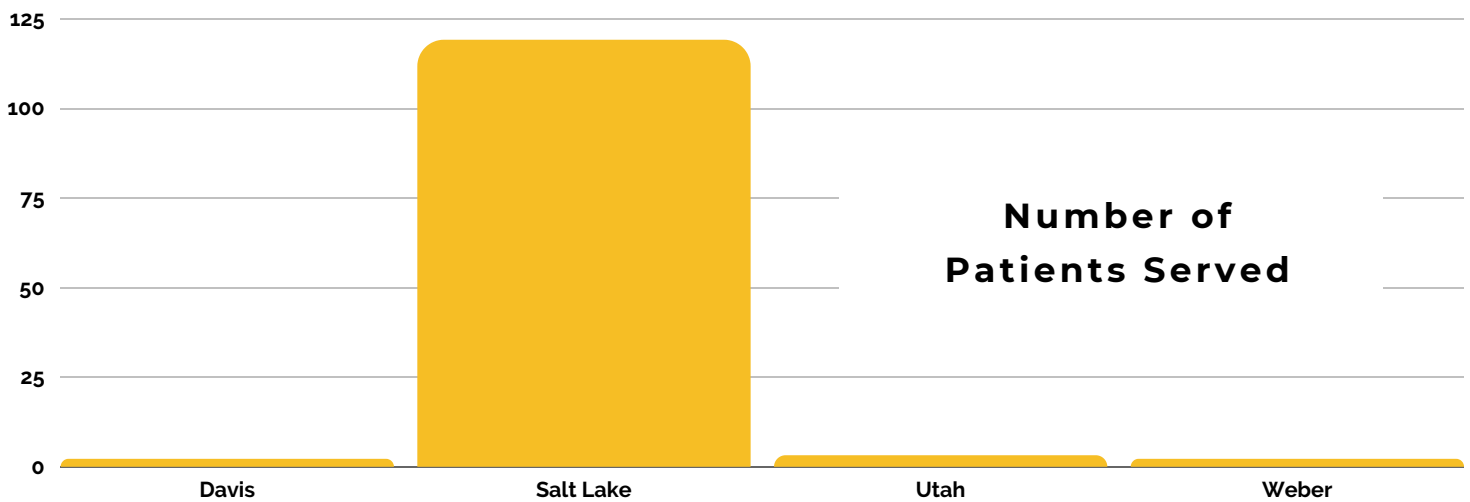
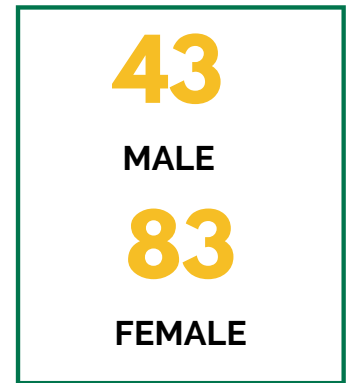

DENTAL PROGRAM

During 2021, the vast majority of patients Senior Charity Care Foundation served were from Salt Lake County; We continue to accept applications from Davis, Salt Lake, Summit, Tooele, Utah, Wasatch and Weber counties.

Of the seniors served through the mobile dental clinic, 68% were female and 32% were male.



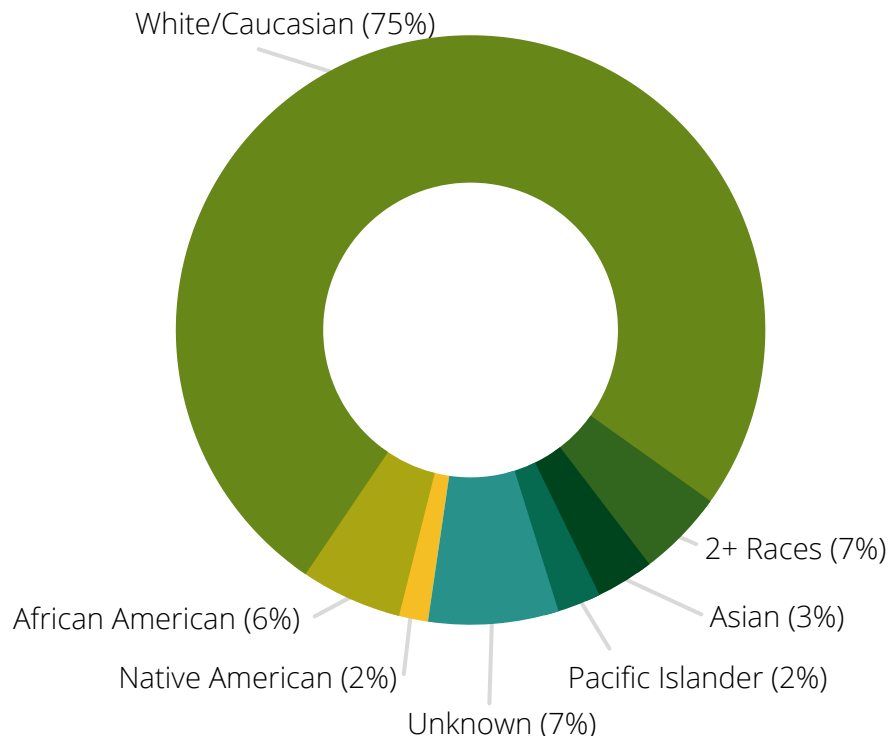
DEMOGRAPHICS

In 2021, 61% of the dental patients served were living at or below 100% of the federal poverty level.

Additionally, 60% of the seniors seen in clinic have one or more disabilities, whether cognitive or physical.

About 75% of the seniors served identified as Caucasian, and 10% identify as Hispanic or Latino.

We were also pleased to serve 9 veterans in our dental clinics this year.

PROGRAM GROWTH

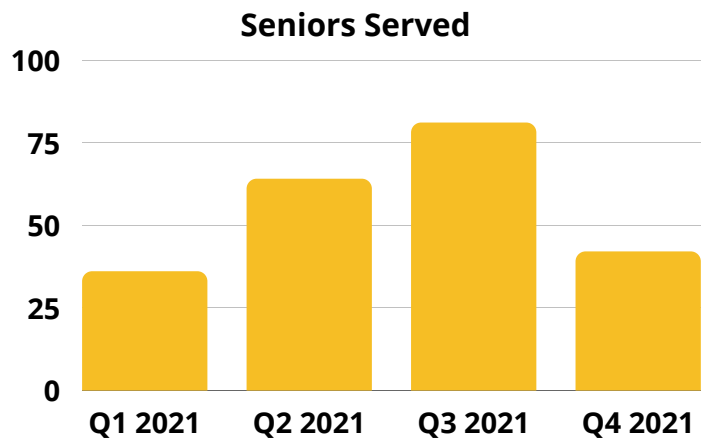
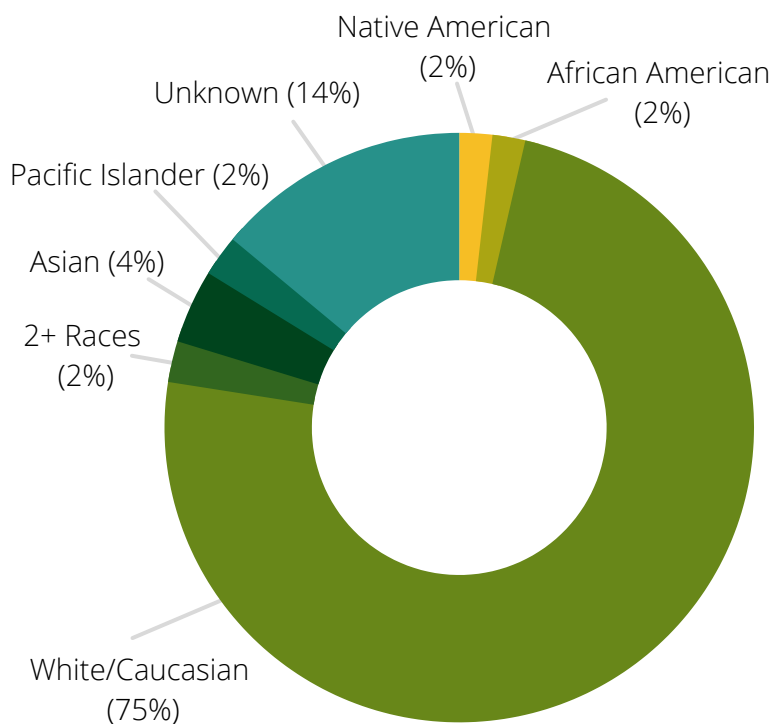
The SCCF mobile vision clinic program grew dramatically in 2021. In total we served 222 seniors. We recently acquired the funds to purchase a second equipment transportation van, so the vision team can operate more efficiently and continue expanding the program. SCCF also contracted a part-time optician.

DEMOGRAPHICS

In 2021, just over 12% of the seniors served in the vision clinics identified as Hispanic or Latino.

The majority (68%) of the vision patients in 2021 were female.

55% of the seniors who received new glasses and eye exams are living at or below 100% of the federal poverty level.



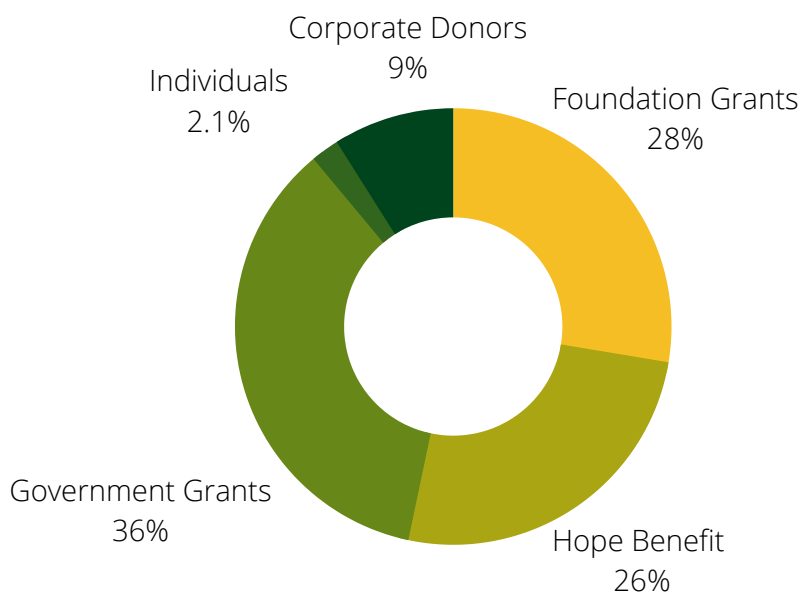

DEVELOPMENT

OVERVIEW

In 2021, Senior Charity Care Foundation raised \$368,575. This is a decrease from 2020; a combination of the drop-off of Covid-19 funds, a lower number of clinics, and new tax laws may have contributed to this decline. The Huntsman Foundation also made a much smaller gift.



FUNDRAISING BREAKDOWN

In total, Senior Charity Care Foundation received \$127,146 in grant funding and corporate donations during the year 2021, excluding Hope Benefit sponsorships. This is a significant decrease from the past two years of fundraising.

Government funding constituted \$123,857 of SCCF income- a large portion of which was the Payroll Protection Program that changed from a loan to a grant. The number of individual donors dropped in 2021, which we can hopefully recapture.

HOPE BENEFIT

The annual Hope Benefit was once again held virtually due to Covid-19. The event was pre-recorded and streamed on our event platform. The program included interviews with seniors we served, recognition of our honorees, and some featured items from the silent auction. In total, the Hope Benefit raised \$90,000. The entire saved event is available for viewing on the Senior Charity Care Foundation YouTube.
